The campaign was launched by the Division of Tourism and Transportation on Tuesday (November 24), as the Division celebrates Tourism Awareness week, which ends Sunday (November 29).

The campaign will bring greater public awareness about all Tobago has to offer. Tourism Secretary Tracy Davidson-Celestine said the Division campaign is aimed at ensuring that "as many Tobagonians as possible come on board [and] be a part of the development of the sector".

She said the campaign was part of the Division's strategy to further develop the

tourism industry. School and community outreach events have been planned, and will target Tobagonians of varying ages, including senior citizens.

## **TOBAGO NOW REPRESENTED ON TDC BOARD**

Tobago how has a representative on the Tourism Development Company (TDC) board, which is a crucial position given the importance of tourism to the island's economy.
