DOMESTIC TOURISM IN FOCUS

t's a simple equation: more visitors equals a stronger economy. And according to Secretary of Tourism and Transportation Tracy Davidson-Celestine, her Division has given priority to developing strategies that will boost market penetration. Particular focus is being placed on the domestic market.

The Secretary said: "Sometimes we criticise the Trinidad market, but it is

the market that is keeping the Caribbean islands afloat, and if we have such an opportunity here, right there in our back door, we will also try to capitalise on that opportunity as well."

Davidson-Celestine said the Division has also been seeking to make further inroads in European markets.

She added that Tobago still has passengers visiting from Scandinavia, as well as two

flights from Manchester, England and Munich, Germany, that recently joined the Tobago route. She said the Division has been working "endlessly to increase flights to the destination".

Davidson-Celestine said 2,380 travel agents have been trained to market Destination Tobago in the last two years. There have also been 60 press trips to the island.
