

Offer of Scholarships by the Government of the Republic of Cuba Undergraduate Studies in the Area of Human Medicine

For Study Commencing Academic Year September 2020

The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago invites **ONLINE** applications from citizens of Trinidad and Tobago to pursue undergraduate degrees under the Cuba Scholarship Programme.

A. Characteristics of the Offer of Scholarship

Purpose of Scholarship	(i) To enhance the human resource capacity in the health sector. (ii) To strengthen bilateral relations between Trinidad and Tobago and Cuba. (iii) To offer scholarships to citizens coming from families with low economic resources.
Number of Scholarships	Four (4) Undergraduate Scholarships in Medicine
Areas of Study to be awarded	Areas in the field of Human Medicine offered for Undergraduate Studies only.
Who Can Apply	Citizens of Trinidad and Tobago
Tenability	Undergraduate degrees are to be pursued at the University as indicated by the Government of the Republic of Cuba. The scholarship is renewed annually subject to satisfactory performance as evidenced by the attainment of a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.50 or a general score of 50% and over.
Deadline date for submission	April 30, 2020 at 4pm.
Response to Application	For Nomination: The range of response time is between 60 to 90 days from the closing date of the scholarship. For Selection: The Government of the Republic of Cuba completes the selection process.
General Conditions of Scholarship	Applicants are advised of the following general conditions of the scholarship: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Ministry responsible for the administration of this scholarship (hereafter referred to as “the Ministry”) reserves the right to publish the names of candidates selected for scholarships. By applying for a scholarship, the candidate gives consent for such publication in the event that his/her application is successful. • Candidates will be given formal notification of the scholarship award, requesting that they indicate their acceptance of the scholarship. • Formal confirmation of the scholarship award will be issued when all conditions have been met. • Scholars will be expected to take up the scholarship award from the date stated by the Ministry in its notification of the scholarship award. • Apart from study related travel, Scholars will be expected to reside in Cuba throughout their program of study. For any proposed visits outside of Cuba, Scholars must seek prior approval from the Ministry, except for visits to Trinidad and Tobago. Expenses for any such travel are not included in this award. • As a general principle, Scholars pursuing these programs shall not undertake paid employment during their awards without prior written consent from the Ministry.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This scholarship award will be used to fund the programme of study for the specified period. • Scholarship holders must not change their programme of study during the tenure of the scholarship except with written consent from the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago and/or the sponsor agency. • Scholarship recipients must maintain satisfactory progress and good standing as stipulated by the academic institution, or the scholarship award will be withdrawn and the recipient liable to repay the Ministry for the funds expended at the date of withdrawal. • Scholarship recipients must follow the approved programme of study and abide by the rules, regulations and codes of conduct of the academic institution. Suspension from the academic institution can lead to termination of the scholarship. Allowances are not payable during the period of suspension. • The Government of the Republic of Cuba will require an original medical report indicating that the nominee is not a carrier of HIV or other infectious diseases. In addition, the medical report must show that he/she does not suffer from a physical or mental impediment that will prevent the exercise of the relevant profession. The nominee must not be pregnant before a scholarship can be confirmed. • The Government of the Republic of Cuba requires documents certifying that nominees have no criminal record. • In accordance with the Scholarship Agreement, Scholars on international programmes will be required to return to Trinidad and Tobago and report in person to the Ministry within one (1) month of completion of the requirements for the award of the degree. • The Government of the Republic of Cuba and the Ministry will only consider requests to extend the scholarship or the candidate to remain in Cuba after the completion of his/her studies only in instances where it is absolutely necessary. <u>Strict conditions will apply.</u> • The Ministry will not provide any letter of non-objection to work in a foreign country on the completion of the programme of study. • All terms and conditions of the award will be subject to laws and practices of the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago. • Scholars will be required to adhere to the laws and practices in the foreign jurisdiction where they reside. • All regulations concerning immigration and visas are set by the Government of the Republic of Cuba and are outside of the control of the Ministry. • Successful candidates will be required to take a Spanish Language Course for one (1) year before starting their academic programme or demonstrate an acceptable proficiency in the Spanish Language. The duration of studies for this scholarship award which is 7 years, includes a remedial Spanish Language Course if necessary. • On successful completion of the programme of study, candidates will be required to sit the Caribbean Association of Medical Councils (CAMC) Examination for registration with the Medical Board of Trinidad and Tobago.
Scholarship Procedure	<p>Applicants will be notified when:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cabinet approves the recommendations of the Ministry; and • The Government of the Republic of Cuba has completed the selection process.

	<p>The scholarship will be governed by a legally binding Scholarship Agreement, one to be executed between the Scholar and Government of the Republic of Cuba and another between the Scholar and the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago. These duly executed Scholarship Agreements along with other scholarship policies and procedures shall be the binding authority between the recipient of this award and the respective governments. <p>The role of the Republic of Government of Trinidad and Tobago (GoRTT)</p>	<p>The Government is responsible for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Disseminating information on the awards; • Ensuring that applications at all stages of the process are completed according to requirements; • Ensuring that only eligible applicants are shortlisted; • Selecting only the most suitable applicants; • Assisting successful nominees in their preparations for taking up the awards; and • Monitoring the scholar’s adherence to the conditions as stipulated in the Scholarship Agreement.

B. Funding

The Government of the Republic of Cuba will pay for/or provide:

Tuition, compulsory fees and books
Accommodation & meals
Health care services
Monthly subsistence

The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago will pay for/or provide:

Monthly supplemental allowance
Round trip return economy air travel

C. Eligibility Criteria

To apply for studies in Medicine, applicants must:

Be citizens of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago and must not be a permanent resident of any other country.

- a) Have a minimum of five (5) General Proficiency (CSEC/GCE) passes which must include: English Language and Mathematics, with Grades I, II, III or A, B, C;
- b) In addition, the applicant must possess:

Either

Four (4) CAPE or GCE (Advanced Level) units with Grades I, II, or III or A, B, and C in a related Science subject such as Biology, Chemistry and/or Physics;

And

Caribbean Studies and Communication Studies or General Paper with Grades I, II, III or A, B, C;

Or

An Associate Degree with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.00 with a major in a related Science subject;

Or

A Bachelor's Degree with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.50 with a major in a related Science subject.

Evidence of any additional qualifications should be submitted with the application.

- c) Be between the ages of eighteen (18) years and twenty-five (25) years old. Applicants must not be turning twenty-five (25) years old within the year.

C. Requirements

a) Applicants are required to submit two (2) Recommendations **electronically**:

- i. One must be an academic recommendation, the other, personal or professional; and
- ii. The recommendations must attest to the applicant's ability to perform and to succeed as a scholarship recipient by providing relevant and practical examples where applicable. They must also describe what contribution and the likely impact the applicant will have on the institution/community/country.

Recommendations must be signed, scanned and uploaded to the online application. Only scanned copies of signed recommendations will be accepted.

b) Applicants applying for an undergraduate degree must prepare a written essay, **'online'** of no more than **500 words**, which:

- i. Identifies a need that exists in the country of Trinidad and Tobago that is perceived as crucial for its development and in line with government expressed policy;
- ii. Indicates the proposed course of study; and
- iii. Discusses the impact the chosen course of study is likely to have on the scholar's capacity to meet the country's needs.

Please ensure your essay is formatted according to the following specifications:

- i. Typed in font style Times New Roman;
- ii. Font size 12;
- iii. Line spacing 1.0;
- iv. Aligned Justified; and
- v. A declared word count is displayed at the end of the study plan/essay.

Your essay must be scanned and uploaded to the online application.

D. Selection Methodology

Applicants will be assessed and recommended for a scholarship on the following:

- i. Academic Merit
- ii. Quality and Content of Essay
- iii. Interview:
 - (Area A) Work and Volunteer Experience and Attributes
 - (Area B) Adaptation/Clarification of Essay
 - (Area C) Evaluation of Need

Please note:

Applicants must upload the following documents to their 'Online' application:

- i. Copies of Academic Certificates, Degrees or Diplomas;
- ii. Copy of **New Polymer Birth Certificate** (with affidavit where necessary);
- iii. Copy of Proof of Change of Name (where necessary);
- iv. Copy of relevant biodata page from valid Trinidad and Tobago Passport. If this is not available, a copy of Electoral Identification Card (back and front);
- v. Persons born outside of Trinidad and Tobago must provide evidence of citizenship (copy) and residency;
- vi. Applicants who are Public Officers must upload a signed letter from their Permanent Secretary/ Head of Department indicating that they have no disciplinary matters pending;
- vii. Any further documents which you prepared and which provide greater insight into your research proposal;
- viii. Applicants are required to submit a **Police Certificate of Character**.

Please Note:

- Applicants must meet all the requirements of this scholarship to be considered eligible.
- Candidates must attain a minimum score of 50% at the interview in order to be considered for the nomination of a scholarship.
- The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago is responsible for the nomination of suitable candidates and this does not in any way guarantee selection or placement for this scholarship.
- All originals must be produced upon request.
- Applicants must ensure that their information on the attached/uploaded documents are legible at a zoom ratio of 100%. Applicants must not submit documents in 'Zip Folders'. Each document should be uploaded in the relevant field on the upload page. Please ensure that your documents are legible by opening and checking the quality of the document before submitting your application online. Applications with documents which are illegible, cannot be verified and will therefore not be processed.
- Successful candidates will be required to submit translated copies of all documents.
