### **PUBLIC STATEMENT 2025**

**In accordance with Sections 7, 8 and 9 of the Freedom of Information Act 1999, Chapter 22:02 (“The FOIA”), The Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development (DIQUD), being a public body under the purview of the Tobago House of Assembly is required by law to publish and annually update this statement, which lists the documents and information generally available to the public.**

The FOIA gives members of the public:

1. The legal right for each person to access information held by the Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development (The Division);
2. A legal right for each person to have personal/official information relating to himself/herself amended where it is held by the Division and such information is incomplete, incorrect or misleading;
3. A legal right to obtain reasons for adverse decisions made regarding an applicant’s request for information under the FOIA;
4. A legal right to complain in writing to the Ombudsman and to apply to the High Court for judicial review to challenge adverse decisions made under the FOIA, Upon a Notice of Refusal.

## **SECTION 7 STATEMENTS**

### **Section 7 (1) (a) (i)**

#### **Function and structure of the Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development.**

##### **Function**

The Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development manages the policy and planning for the sustainable development of Tobago's infrastructural network, natural resources and space. The goal of the Division is to sustain and improve the island's infrastructure networks in a manner that protects and preserves the environment, while at the same time secure and drive Tobago's socio-economic growth. It's core responsibilities are as follows:

- Construction, development and maintenance of the road network and drainage systems
- Construction and maintenance of public buildings and facilities
- The production and sale of quality volcanic rock products, concrete and asphalt
- Transport and Traffic Management

The Division also has oversight for the Licensing Division (Tobago) and the Studley Park Enterprise Limited (SPEL), a wholly owned subsidiary of the Tobago House of Assembly charged with the management of the Studley Park Quarry.

## **Organizational Structure**

**The Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development comprises the organizational structure as is depicted at Appendix 1.**

### **Office of The Secretary**

The Office of the Secretary is responsible for the formulating of policies relative to the mandate of the Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development. The Secretary exercises general control and direction over the Division.

### **Office of The Assistant Secretary**

The Office of the Assistant Secretary provides assistance to the Secretary by carrying out specific roles and responsibilities for the Division.

### **Office of The Administrator**

The Administrator serves as an accounting officer, responsible for meeting the mandates and desired results of the Division. The Administrator oversees the functioning of the various departments/units within the Division.

### **Administrative Support Services Department**

The primary objective of the Administrative Support Services Department is to support the activities of the Core Departments, in order to ensure the implementation of the Division's mandate. The Department comprises the Human Resources, Accounting, Information Technology, Legal, Communications, Procurement and Project Management Office.

### **Human Resources Department**

The Human Resources Department has responsibility for planning, organizing and controlling all human resource management activities in Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development. The responsibilities of the Department concern the personnel and industrial relations of Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development and involve all matters relevant to employees from their recruitment to their exit from the Public Service by way of retirement or resignation.

This Department is responsible for ensuring that DIQUD human resource requirements at all levels are met; for recruitment of personnel to fill vacancies which arise, and for maintaining the personnel files of all DIQUD employees, which includes information on promotions, transfers, leave, confidential reports, disciplinary and other matters relating to conditions of employment in the Public Service or on contract.

### **Accounting Department**

The Accounting Department is responsible for management of the Division's financial allocations, and is responsible for processing payments of staff wages and salaries, and payments for services provided to the Division, on proof of proper authorization for same.

## **Legal Unit**

This unit Provides legal advice and representation to the Administrator and other stakeholders on matters relevant to the Division. It also Drafts and reviews employment and service provider contracts and Memoranda of Understanding for the Division.

## **Information Technology Unit**

The Information Technology Unit is responsible for the provision of information technology services required to facilitate the efficient and effective delivery of the Division's business processes. It also provides networking and technical support to all Departments of the Division.

By capturing and leveraging the value of information, the Division will be able to gain and gauge the operational efficiency of itself and also impact its stakeholders; inclusive of Tobago Communities.

The Responsibilities include:

- a. Ensuring high availability and security of all ICT Infrastructure.
- b. Responding and resolving Help Desk service requests.
- c. Implementing and operating application systems across the DIQUD, inclusive of Accounting and HR/Payroll.

## **Communication Unit**

The Communication Unit markets and coordinates events, maintains website and social media content and disseminates information about the activities of the Division through press releases. The Communications Unit also facilitates effective communication and customer service to both internal and external stakeholders. This unit is charged with developing, guiding and updating the Division's communications strategy and policy with a view to enhancing the image and reputation of the Division, positively promote its brand and maintain beneficial cooperation between the Division and its internal and external stakeholders. Moreover, the Communications Unit is responsible for communication planning and brand management; speech writing and editing; internal communications; media and public relations; events management; crisis and issues management and photographic archiving.

## **Procurement Unit**

Manages the procurement of services and materials for the Division in accordance with Public Procurement legislation.

## **Technical Services**

### **The Development Programme**

This Department undertakes infrastructural work on the island pertaining to the construction of drains, sidewalks, retaining walls, road alignment, building construction and roundabouts. This programme is further sub-divided into four districts (Mason Hall/Moriah, Scarborough, Roxborough, and Speyside) that are charged with the responsibility of the maintenance of Roads, Bridges and Sanitation Services.

### **Project Management Office**

Coordinates, supervises and conducts quality checks on construction and related services undertaken by contracted service providers.

### **Maintenance Services**

The Maintenance Services Department (Roads and Buildings) is responsible for the construction, rehabilitation and maintenance of roads and bridges, and the construction and maintenance of government facilities and other public buildings. It also collaborates with the Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) and is further sub-divided into four districts namely: Mason Hall/Moriah, Scarborough, Roxborough and Speyside.

### **Traffic Management Unit**

The Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development has adopted the position for strategic planning and the reliance on data for traffic and transportation management. The Unit is responsible for the proper maintenance of traffic signals, road signs and markings. The Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development completed several transportation and traffic initiatives which focused on targeted planning for Tobago's infrastructures and systems, which will improve road user interfaces and safety.

### **Mechanical Services**

This section conducts repairs and maintains the Division's fleet of vehicles. It is also responsible for the fabrication and machining of components for the Division and other entities such as WASA and T&TEC.

### **Licensing Department**

This Department falls under the jurisdiction of the Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development. It is mandated to execute the policies of the Ministry of Works and Transport as they relate to the issuance of drivers permits, the inspection of vehicles and adherence to the Motor Vehicle and Road Traffic Act. This Department also conducts required examinations for motorists.

### **Unemployment Relief Programme**

The Unemployment Relief Programme (URP) provides short term employment with a major emphasis on training, which is geared towards the enhancement of entrepreneurial skills of participants. The Department also assists in small scale projects in communities, and is strategically organized to assist with emergency and

disaster response as it relates to clean up efforts, rehabilitation of beaches and infrastructural damage throughout communities. URP also focuses heavily on the development of agricultural initiatives.

### **Studley Park Enterprise Limited (SPEL)**

The Studley Park Enterprise Limited (SPEL) is a private company wholly-owned by the Tobago House of Assembly. The Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development (DIQUD) has the direct oversight for the Company. SPEL was officially incorporated in 2016 and is charged with the management of the Quarry at Studley Park; a resource deemed one of Tobago's prized industry with great potential for revenue generation. The range of products offered by Studley Park Enterprise Limited (SPEL) for sale on the local and national market include aggregate, crusher run, rotten rock and boulders, amongst others. The operations also include a Concrete Batching Plant and a Hot Mix Asphalt Batching Plant.

1. Requests and public services under the FOIA will be entertained between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., Monday to Friday.
2. All requests for access to documents that are not readily available in the public domain are to be made on the **Request for access to official document(s) form** that is available from the Designated Officer or officer assigned from the Legal Department.

The relevant information that must be provided to the Division includes:

- Full name of applicant
- Contact information
- Information requested and required format
- Date of Request
- Signature of applicant

3. Queries for amendments to documents containing personal information about the applicant are to be directed to the Designated Officer in the form of a letter.
4. To ensure prompt handling of requests, please address requests to the Designated Officer of the Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development or an officer assigned for this purpose. The Designated Officer is named at Section 7 (1) (a) (vi).
5. Requests will be acknowledged as official when made on the prescribed form.
6. Applicants must provide sufficient information to enable the Designated Officer to identify the document(s) being requested.

**Requests not handled under the FOIA** - A request under the FOIA will not be processed to the extent that it seeks information that is readily available in the public domain, either from the Division or from another public authority, for example brochures and pamphlets etc.

## **Responding to requests**

The Division is required to furnish copies of documents only when they are in our possession or we can retrieve them from storage. Some old records may have been destroyed prior to the commencement of the FOIA, and as

such, it would be impossible to grant such requests. Various laws, regulations and manuals give the time periods for preserving records before they can be destroyed.

### **Furnishing documents**

An applicant is entitled to copies of information we have in our possession, custody or power. We are required to furnish only one copy of a document. If we cannot make a legible copy of a document to be released, we will not attempt to reconstruct it. Instead, we will furnish the best copy possible and note its quality in our reply. Please note that the Division is not compelled to do the following:

- a) create new documents; or
- b) perform research for you.

### **Time limits**

The FOIA establishes a time limit of thirty (30) days for the Division to make the decision whether or not to disclose the documents requested by the applicant. Where the Division fails to meet this deadline, the FOIA gives the applicant the right to proceed as if the request had been denied.

Where the request for information is refused, the applicant would be informed in writing of the reason for the refusal. The Designated Officer will communicate with the applicant about alternative courses available to him/her.

Every effort will be made to comply with the time limits, however, if it appears that processing the requests may take longer than the statutory limit, we will acknowledge the request and advise the applicant of its status. Since there is a possibility that requests may be wrongly addressed or routed, the applicant may wish to call or write to confirm that we have received the request and to ascertain its status.

### **Fees and Refunds**

The Freedom of Information (Fees and Charges) Regulations prescribes the fees to be incurred in making the documents available. Where such fees are payable, the applicant is entitled to receive the document(s) within seven (7) days of payment of the relevant fee. If we fail to provide the information within the seven (7) day period, the applicant is entitled to a refund of the fees paid in addition to free access to the document (s) requested.

### **Division's Opening Hours**

The offices of the Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and Urban Development are open to the public from 8am to 4:15pm, Monday to Thursday and 8am to 4pm on Fridays. Persons can seek information on any matter pertaining to FOI, and can speak with staff members at other sections and departments during these hours.
